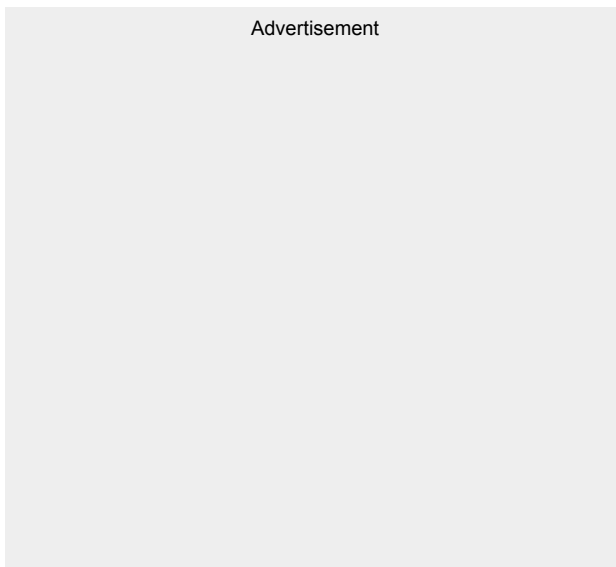

Rosetta-Wireless lands fed'l grant

Rosetta-Wireless Corp. has been awarded a \$2-million grant from the U.S. Department of Commerce to continue development of its Wireless Intelligent Personal Server, a wallet-sized computer. The West Chicago upstart is one of 16 companies nationwide to receive funding via the federal government's Advanced Technology Program, designed to bolster firms developing technologies with significant commercial potential. Rosetta's technology delivers massive amounts of continuously updated data to the wallet-sized devices.
